### **Zones of Regulation**

At this week's assembly we spent some time talking about what we can do to when we are sitting in the Yellow (Frustrated) or Red (Angry) zone and moving to the calm Green zone. We looked at the following strategies that can help to regulate how we are feeling in difficult situations.

- 1. Stop and Breathe Take 3 deep breaths
- 2. Use Your Words Tell a teacher or friend how you're feeling.
- 3. Take a Break Sit in a quiet area to reset.
- **4.** <u>Make a Good Choice Think:</u> Where is a safe place for me to play?
- **5.** <u>Fix the Problem</u> Say sorry if needed, or find a teacher to help.

### **School Saving Bonus**

The Victorian Government is delivering the School Saving Bonus (SSB) – a one-off support of \$400 for eligible government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025.

The SSB can be used for uniforms and textbooks until **Monday 30 June 2025**.

Any funds remaining after 30 June 2025, including online voucher amounts that have not been redeemed, will become a credit to use on school activities (but not textbooks or uniforms).
